3-6 NEWS

Our 3-6 year olds continue to build community by learning what it means to accept and value each person for their unique qualities. On the geography shelf, we're learning about the seven continents, and in science, our focus is trees and apples. In math, we're working with numbers 0-10 in a variety of configurations, writing equations within10, and identifying one less/one more. In language arts, we're practicing daily phonological fluency exercises and responding to texts to strengthen vocabulary and comprehension skills. Explicit phonics and handwriting instruction is now underway and we are emerging as readers and writers. 3-6 finished up learning about apples and are moved on to pumpkins and learning about the continents.



6-9 NEWS

6-9 traveled to the Aronoff to see the Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane and there are two more Aronoff field trips to come. They received 6 ipads for each class! Gifted testing happened for all 2nd graders and 3rd grading state testing happened at the end of October.



9-12 NEWS

9-12 had some great field trip s! 6th grade went on a Canoe field trip and 4th graders visited Fort Ancient. All 9-12 classes have a mindfulness tool kit to help students re-focus if needed. 4th and 5th grades began their introduction to pinhole photography, using oatmeal cans and pop cans to make cameras!

OHIO ATTENDANCE LAW

Ohio House Bill 410 has changed the way attendance is to be tracked within school systems. All student attendance is now tracked by the number of hours in attendance as opposed to days. This means late arrivals and early dismissals as counted as hours absent from school and documented in the CPS attendance portal Our social worker, Nick Balle, will be monitoring all attendance related matters and may be reaching out to families for further clarification.

YMCA AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

Pleasant Ridge Montessori does offer an after-school program that is hosted by the YMCA. The hours of operation are 2:15-6pm daily, with dinner included. The cost of the program is \$70 weekly per child; vouchers from Job and Family Services are accepted. There are openings still available for the program; however filling up quickly.
